



By the time you get this newsletter, we will be close to or have already begun early voting for the May 5th elections. The only item that is unique to Windcrest will be the referendum. This referendum was brought to the City Council in January and placed on the ballot per our City Charter. The referendum reads:

**“Shall the creation of the Windcrest Volunteer Bugle Crew be repealed and cancellation of the fire protection agreement between the Windcrest Fire Department and the Windcrest Volunteer Fire Department Bugle Crew be mandated?”**

Unfortunately, there was some confusion on the March primary election. Some years ago, the City Council decided to partner with Bexar County to accomplish elections. This was done to save money rather than pay for our own elections. The Bexar County Elections office (with guidance from the County Commissioners), decides the locations for early voting and election day. Bexar County sent the date for the March election to the City Staff just a few weeks prior to the beginning of early voting, and the Staff was not able to move previously scheduled events at Takas Park. Bexar County decided not to hold early voting in Windcrest but did set the election location at Windcrest Elementary School. They also indicated the May election early voting would also be outside of Windcrest.

Councilmember Pedrotti and I visited with Jacquelyn Callanen (Bexar County Elections Administrator) to see what could be done. We are happy to announce the May elections (there will be two of them) and the November elections (early voting and election day voting) will take place at Takas Park. We confirmed with the City Staff that the dates are clear, and we are good to go.

Here are the Dates: Election Day – May 5th. Early voting April 23rd through May 2nd  
Election Day – May 22nd. Early voting May 14th through May 18th  
Election Day – November 6th. Early voting October 22nd through November 2nd

You may also vote by mail if: you are going to be away from the county during early voting and election day; you are sick or disabled; or you are over the age of 65. You can call the elections office at 210-335-0365 to get help with the process.

The City Staff will be updating the website and we will ensure the information is on our Facebook page

communications system. We also take time to show appreciation to our Windcrest Police Department Communications Officers during the week of April 8- 14, 2018. Our Communications Officers are critical to ensuring the highest quality of public safety response in the City of Windcrest. These men and women work tirelessly providing unequalled service to our community... "A voice in the darkness that gives HOPE"! They provide all Emergency Communications to the City of Windcrest to include 9-1-1 Emergency Calls, Non-Emergency Calls and complete radio communications for a very busy Windcrest Police Department. Our Communications Officers are truly "Second to None".



It is imperative that citizens of all ages are well versed in the role they play in ensuring effective and efficient emergency response for themselves and their fellow citizens. An important reminder... If you need emergency services in Windcrest and you are using a cellular phone when calling 9-1-1, you may reach another call center such as the City of San Antonio 9-1-1 depending on what cellular tower is involved. Make sure you tell the 9-1-1 Operator that you are in the City of Windcrest, Texas and you need Windcrest Police, Fire or EMS. This will ensure that your call is routed to the Windcrest Police Department Communications Center without delay. Calling 9-1-1 for an emergency means that your Windcrest Police Department is on the way to protect and serve!

I have heard many inquiries concerning the possibility of the newly formed Windcrest Volunteer Fire Department Bugle Crew having the ability to charge residents or property owners for providing service. Some have even said that they were told that they could be charged \$500 for a service call by the fire department.



While the FIRE PROTECTION AGREEMENT between the City of Windcrest and the Windcrest Volunteer Fire Department Bugle Crew does include the standard language as follows – “3. WVFDBC may charge any resident or property owner for the provision of any service within the corporate limits of the city. However, all rates and charge schedules must be approved in advance by the city.” This standard language is provided to protect against the possibility of faulty alarms that go off regularly without being attended to by the responsible party.

I can assure you that no such rates or charge schedules have even been considered by the City Council. The majority of the current sitting council has been very involved in eliminating or reducing fees to Windcrest residents for the past several years. I sure hope no one wants to reverse that trend.



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

## WINDCREST SPRING BRUSH CURBSIDE PICKUP MAY 21<sup>ST</sup>-JUNE 8<sup>TH</sup>



On Monday, May 21st the Spring Brush Pick up service will begin. The service will be available according to which section of the city your home is located in. A map of the sections will be available at City Hall, on the City website and a postcard will be mailed out to make sure you understand which section your house is in.

**Section 1:** Curb service will begin Monday, May 21st and run through Friday, May 25th. Everyone in section 1 must have their collectables out on the curb by Sunday, May 20th and no earlier than Friday, May 18th. Republic Services will go through each section once. If you are late putting your collection items out, they will not return for additional service.

**Section 2:** Curb service will begin Monday, May 28 and run through Friday, June 1st. Everyone in section 2 must have their collectables out on the curb by Sunday, May 27th and no earlier than Friday, April 25th. Republic Services will go through each section once. If you are late putting your collection items out, they will not return for additional service.

**Section 3:** Curb service will begin Monday, June 4th and run through Friday, June 8th. Everyone in section 3 must have their collectables out on the curb by Sunday, June 3rd and no earlier than Friday, June 1st. Republic Services will go through each section once. If you are late putting your collection items out, they will not return for additional service.

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

Happy spring...I hope everyone is enjoying the beautiful sunny days. The city-wide brush pickup will be May 21 through June 8th this year. Please check your correct pickup dates and please do not put items out too early. Take this opportunity to remove any materials you may want to dispose of. Don't forget to clean your backyard and dispose of any items or brush you may have collected. Remember, poor maintenance means, maintaining premises in a manner that creates an unsanitary condition likely to attract or harbor mosquitoes, rodents, vermin, or disease-carrying pests. Please remember to clean your alley area behind your property fence and keep it clear for trash service trucks and public safety vehicles to get by with no problem. I will be in the area inspecting swimming pools so please keep your swimming pool clean and properly fenced.

As a reminder, if you miss brush pickup you will be responsible for disposal of excess materials. **Residential garbage, waste and refuse placed outside for pickup shall be stored in a durable metal or hardened rubber container with a tightly sealed insect-proof and animal-proof lid. The only trash bags allowed on the curb are for the disposal of leaves, grass trimmings or other items, however, NO food based products are allowed.**

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# WCID #10

The Board of Directors approved the following: (1) sale of water to the new Wash Tub facility coming to Windcrest; (2) installation of bullet proof safety glass in the District office for the safety of our office personnel; (3) adoption of the Fire Hydrant policy approved by the Windcrest City Council; (4) the revised 2018 Policy and Procedures Manual and (5) a contractor's bid for the Well 3 electrical work (\$33,000 lower than our estimate).

A new water rate for both residential and commercial water service and usage was adopted by the Board of Directors. This new water rate still places our rates below the average for water in this area. There had not been a rate increase since the 1990s, and our CIP study shows that we have \$13,000,000 of infrastructure that needs to be repaired or replaced in the next 1-10 years. Without the rate increase these repairs/replacements could not be paid for.

The Board approved Thomas Spurgeon as the District's Bond Council. A resolution was approved to file the requisite paperwork with Texas Commission on Environmental Quality to get approval for Phase I of our Capital Improvement Plan(CIP). That same resolution approved starting all necessary documentation required to issue Tax-Exempt Revenue Notes to fund the CIP projects.

A contract for sale of the District's property at 5507 Randolph Blvd. was approved. The sales price was \$270,000. The buyer will have 120 days to get the appropriate zoning for his business. The approval will have to come through the City of San Antonio.

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
## Weatherization Assistance Program

### Purpose

The AACOG Weatherization Assistance Program (WAP) is designed to help low-income people, particularly the elderly and handicapped, overcome the high cost of energy through the installation of energy conservation measures at no cost to the applicant. Although the program does not address major home repairs, it can help lower the amount of energy used in a home by enhancing the structure's thermal boundary. Like a styrofoam cup, the house will stay warmer in the winter and cooler in the summer. The less energy it takes to heat or cool the house, the more money is saved.

Qualification for Weatherization Services is a three-step process. The applicant's total household income must meet federal income eligibility requirements. The 2016 Federal Poverty Level is used to identify the funding source your household qualifies



for. The person completing the application (The Applicant) must be a U.S. Citizen or show proof of eligible Resident Alien Status to receive federal benefits. Lastly, the home itself must be structurally sound (no major roof repairs, plumbing leaks, foundation problems, faulty electrical wiring or similar structural issues).

### The Weatherization Process

1. Submitted application packets with required support documents are reviewed and program eligibility is determined.
2. An energy assessment and audit of the home is performed
3. Installation of approved weatherization measures (e.g., attic / wall insulation, replacement or repair of heating and air conditioning equipment, etc.).
4. A final inspection to assure work quality completeness and customer satisfaction.



## Failure to Appear Upon Notice To Appear

Whenever you received a Municipal Court Summons for a traffic offense or violation of the Code of Ordinances, it will have a date and time in which you are required to appear before the Municipal Court Judge. If you do not appear, did you know that you have violated a City Code? Chapter 20 of the Windcrest Code of Ordinances Sec. 20-5 states, "(a) Offense. Any person, who, having received notice to appear in the municipal court of the city, as a defendant, witness or complainant, commits an offense if he intentionally, knowingly, or negligently fails to appear in accordance with the terms of the notice." It also states, (c) When action upon warrant required. If a peace officer is required to act on a warrant for arrest issued in accordance with this chapter to secure the presence of the person in the municipal court of the city, upon conviction, the court may authorize a warrant fee to be assessed against the person, in addition to the fine and those court costs authorized by this chapter and the state. If this should ever happen to you, please contact the Windcrest Municipal Court immediately for more information at (210) 655-0022.



It's that time of year again as the weather's warming up and all the critters are becoming active. Animal owners, please provide your pets with veterinary care to ensure good health. Make sure your pet has a complete series of vaccinations to address Kennel Cough, Parvovirus, Distemper and Rabies. Don't forget about preventative medication such as heartworm and flea-tick control. Do not expose your pet to crowded and/or poorly ventilated areas, cigarette smoke or travel stress. Second hand smoke is very bad for animals as well!

Pets should always be protected from environment extremes such as storms, precipitation, outside temperatures of 85 degrees or above, and cold temperatures of 32 degrees or below. Provide your pets with alternatives from these extremes such as shade, ventilated pet houses, lean-to shelter, tent, garage, or inside your home. Be sure your pet always has access to fresh clean water. While walking your pet outdoors, remember to have them on a leash... it's the law! Don't forget...if the asphalt is too hot for your feet, then it's too hot for your pet! Most importantly, remember to register-update your pet with the City each year.

## Trap-Neuter-return (TNR)

TRAP: Humanely trap cats.

NEUTER: Take the cats in their traps to a veterinarian or clinic to be spayed or neutered, vaccinated, and eartipped.



RETURN: After the cats have recovered from surgery, return them to their outdoor homes where they were trapped.

Trap-Neuter-Return is the humane and effective approach for stray and feral cats. Now in practice for decades in the US after being proven in Europe, scientific studies show that Trap-Neuter-Return improves the lives of feral cats, improves their relationships with the people who live near them, and decreases the size of colonies over time..... a testimony to how well this approach works. That's why the number of municipalities that officially endorse this approach increased tenfold between 2003 and 2013. Grounded in science, TNR stops the breeding cycle of cats and therefore improves their lives while preventing reproduction. It is a fact that the removal and killing of outdoor cats is not effective. Since feral cats are not adoptable, they are killed in pounds and shelters. This community adopted the TNR program in 2009. Since then more and more people have stepped up to be a part of that solution by offering to be care-givers. That means monitoring the group of cats and making sure they have food and proper care. It is spending time and resources to trap, transporting the cat to a clinic for the sterilization and immunization and then providing the care necessary while the cat recovers. At the end, the cat returns to its area where trapped. If you are interested in participating in the TNR here in Windcrest, please contact animal control or call 210-562-0299. If you are just feeding the cats in your area, please contact that number to make sure the cats are sterilized. Then be part of the solution and become a TNR care giver.

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

# CITY OF WINDCREST OFFICE OF EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT

## WINDCREST RESIDENTS ENCOURAGED TO REGISTER FOR THE REGIONAL EMERGENCY ALERT NETWORK (REAN)

In an effort to improve communication during emergency situations, the City of Windcrest Office of Emergency Management is encouraging residents to register for the Regional Emergency Alert Network (REAN) system. REAN is a mass emergency notification service which allows Windcrest public safety personnel to contact you in the event of an emergency. REAN is analogous to SA Alert in San Antonio and Bexar County and by subscribing to the REAN system; you are placing your contact information into a Regional Emergency Notification system that encompasses the Bexar County area. The REAN system is a supplemental system and not a replacement for existing public safety warning and information systems such as television and radio. No one can fully guarantee that you will receive a notification every time due to the unforeseen circumstances of large-scale emergencies that are either natural or unnaturally occurring within this community. Please keep yourself informed during emergencies by monitoring local radio and television stations.

Traditional systems similar to this were previously limited strictly to land-line phones. Bexar County has improved the system and now registers multiple means of communication so that mobile contact information is included in the 911 database. Windcrest citizens must be registered in the REAN system to receive emergency notifications. During the registration process users are able to register to receive emergency notifications via phone call, text messaging, and/or email, based on addresses that they specify (home, work, school, parent's house, etc.). Emergency alerts will be disseminated during the duration of an emergency and will cease to broadcast when public safety officials deem the imminent threat has passed or activation settings expire. The City of Windcrest Office of Emergency Management encourages residents to also stay informed during emergencies by monitoring local radio and television stations. Other means of communication that Windcrest public safety officials may use during an emergency also include: Notifications made door-to-door or by public broadcast equipment with information or instruction and the City's website provides information to the media and the public during emergency situations. This information can be accessed from a computer or electronic devices. The City of Windcrest also encourages residents to stay up to date by following the City of Windcrest Facebook page.

Phone calls from the Regional Emergency Alert Network may display "210-408-8302" and "EMERGENCY" on landline devices equipped with Caller ID. Cell phones, by default, will not display "EMERGENCY" with the incoming telephone number. Please save 210-408-8302 in your cell phone contacts as "EMERGENCY" to assist in quickly identifying the incoming call as a Regional Emergency Alert Network (REAN) message. Additionally, SMS (text messages) are sent via the identifying codes 89361 and 87844. By adding each code into contacts as "Emergency", texts are easily identified and associated with an emergency activation. Use of this system allows Windcrest public safety officials the ability to send mass notifications to registered users through both land-lines and a variety of electronic devices during a natural or other emergency in the area. The information you provide during the REAN registration process is protected and for emergency notification purposes only and will not be shared with any other entity. Once registered, a confirmation will be sent to registrants and they must respond using the link to activate the service.
