

Mayor's Message

As you may have noticed, there are some changes to the Newsletter. We have made room to add more articles to show residents, as well as potential residents, the wonderful sense of community we all enjoy in our small town.

One of the key issues brought to my attention is the need to keep our streets in good repair, particularly the major streets. A Committee was formed called the "Street CIP Bonds Project" (CIP stands for Capital Improvement Plan). This group will collect information on the status of the streets, options for street repairs and they will provide the Council with their prioritized list of repairs. If the suggested repairs exceed the funds available, the Council could elect to hold a bond election. If we do a bond, it will be up to the Citizens to vote to issue or not issue the bonds.

As you are probably aware, the voters decided by a vote of 693 to 246 to repeal the creation of the Windcrest Volunteer Fire Bugle Crew and the cancellation of the agreement between the Windcrest Fire Department and the Windcrest Volunteer Fire Department Bugle crew. This in NO way eliminated the Windcrest Volunteer Fire Department. We always need volunteers to serve in many capacities. Please reach out the Fire Chief and see how you can serve.

If you are interested in serving the community, we have developed an "Application to serve on a City Board/Commission/Committee." The intent will be to gather a data base and identify where citizens would like to volunteer.

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BEXAR COUNTY WATER CONTROL AND IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT #10

INFORMATION

Windcrest is 2.3 Square Miles and has 2400 customers. There are plus or minus about 5,000 citizens in Windcrest. This is important to know to understand the relevance of the following WCID #10 facts.

Bexar County WCID #10 has 1625.325 acre feet of water rights. That is 530 million gallons of water for use in any one year. One-acre feet of water can satisfy 3 homes for a year. Our 1625.325 acre feet of water rights can satisfy the needs of 4875 homes. The District's highest year of water usage was 1300 acre feet and our normal usage is 1000 acre feet a year.

The District has 4 wells that draw water from the Edwards Aquifer. The District's pumping capacity from those wells is 6.5 million gallons per day. Our records since 2001 show the highest single day of pumping was 2.4 million gallons. We are in the process of getting well 3 rewired and purchasing a portable generator that can supply all of the water that Windcrest will use in case of an emergency from well 3. The other 3 wells will also be rewired during Phase I and II of our Capital Improvement Plan, and the new generator can be used at any of our 4 wells.

It is comforting to know that the District owns enough water rights to supply all of our City's water needs in rainy or dry conditions. The District can supply the City's entire water requirements from any one of the District's wells even in an emergency where there is no electricity for pumping.

New businesses will not compromise our water sufficiency. When a business builds a new building in Windcrest the District's policy is that the business must purchase the water rights for the amount of water the business will use in a year and donate those water rights to the District in order to receive services.

The District has three storage facilities that hold 1.085 million gallons which is one normal day's worth of water usage.

There are thirty-five miles of water mains and 28 miles of sewer mains in the District. These water mains and sewer mains are made of material that have a life expectancy of 40 years. These, of course, must be maintained and replaced as needed.

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Economic Development Corporation

Happy June! It has been a busy month for the WEDC in Windcrest! After the road improvements on IH 35 the signage designating Windcrest exits were virtually eliminated.

In December 2017 the President of the WEDC Board, Sue Alexander; Vice President, Irv Gerrow; and City Manager, Rafael Castillio, met with two TxDOT representatives to request additional Windcrest exit signage off IH 35 and 410. TxDOT agreed in February 2018 that TxDOT would add five Windcrest exit signs by the end of this year! There will be two additional signs on North bound IH 35 as well as two additional signs on South bound IH 35. There will also be an additional Windcrest exit sign posted coming off 410. These signs will assure that “Windcrest” is prominently displayed at exits as they were prior to the improvements made to IH 35 in our area.

It is critically important to the nearly 200 businesses in Windcrest that the exit signs off of IH 35 and 410 are prominent in order for shoppers outside of Windcrest to be able to easily locate our City and Windcrest businesses.

Sand Dollar Pools Inc.

Sand Dollar Pools, Inc. of Windcrest is celebrating its 50th year of being in business. David Posson, President of Sand Dollar Pools Inc., carried on his family business which was started by his mother and father in 1968 in Live Oak. For the last thirty-four years Sand Dollar Pools has had its home in Windcrest. When the Possons started their business, they were coined the original fiber glass manufacture of pools in South Texas. The Possons specialized in manufacturing fiber glass pools until the Mid 1980’s. As their clientele began to grow, they opened their retail store where they still sell supplies for pool owners to maintain, clean and enjoy their pools.

Sand Dollar Pools Inc. not only provides their services to pool owners in the Windcrest and San Antonio area, but they also provide sales and services to customers over the entire Central, East and South Texas area. They have transported pool to San Angelo, Laredo, Corpus Christi all the way up to Sea Brook on the Coast. They also service pools in Houston and Austin.

“I’m really thankful for our time here in Windcrest,” said David Poisson. “Some

of our Windcrest customers have been with us for over 30 years! It has been so nice to have good neighbors and good customers so in return we have tried to be good neighbors as well.”

Five years ago David Posson heard about the Windcrest Economic Development’s Store Front Grant Program. The Program helps businesses make improvements to their store fronts which also enhances our City. Prior to starting an improvement, a business can present its plans for upgrading its store front to the WEDC Board, and if the Board approves the project, the business can get up to one-half of the cost (limit of \$9,999) of the improvement paid for by the WEDC when the project is completed. Mr. Posson completed the application and went before the Board to present his project. The Board members approved the grant, and he was able to purchase the beautiful Sand Dollar Pools sign customers and residents see on Crestway in the front of their business.

Sand Dollar Pools is one of Windcrest’s great Corporate Citizens, and Windcrest is privileged to have this business in our City. Congratulations for 50 years of doing business!




The Car Wash Express

Windcrest is excited to have another family owned and operated family business moving into our neighborhood. The Wash Tub was started by Al and Dorothy Vizza. In 1986, they opened their first location on Blanco road. They have since then opened twenty-five locations employing over 1,200 employees and average washing about 1.7 million cars annually. The local investment off of Fourwinds Dr. is approximately a \$2 million and will have 3 full time employees. The 14 stall state of the art fully automated car wash is under construction and expected to open soon.

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WINDCREST WCID #10 BOARD MEETING NOTES

The WCID Board of Directors approved the Unmodified Audit report by the District’s Auditor’s, Baker, Tilly, Virchow, and Krause. An Unmodified Audit report means that it was a “clean” audit, and there were no discrepancies or deficiencies found. Our office personnel, General Manager, and Board of Directors deserve credit for these excellent audit results.

As was stated in our May article, the auditors suggested hiring a part-time employee to permit more oversight in our internal controls. The Auditors suggested having separate people to do the following: one person to order services and goods and a different person to process accounts payable; have one person to process payroll who has no access to the payroll accounts and one person who could access payroll accounts but who has no access to process payroll; one person to review new rates entered into the billing system and another person to update the rates; etc. The Board acted on this recommendation and approved the hiring of a part-time person. In addition to strengthening internal controls, an additional person will allow the District to cross-train our office employees to ensure continuity in the absence of an employee.

The electrical improvements to well #3 are fully underway and will be completed by June. The District will soon purchase a portable generator. With these improvements to well #3 if our City has a disaster such as a tornado that interrupts the electrical service, Bexar County WCID #10 will be able to supply all of our City’s water needs from well #3 for as long as is required. We can live without electricity, but we cannot adequately live without water. With the improvements to well #3 and the purchase of a portable generator, Windcrest will be assured an adequate water supply in an emergency.

All Windcrest fire hydrants were checked and are working.

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
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POLICE DEPARTMENT NEWS

Chief Police A.O. "Al" Ballow

By the time you read this...we will be deep in the heart of summer! Many of you will be out and about with your families, going to the zoo, the park or taking a family vacation. If you are prepared, you have a plan in place to prevent crime and keep you and your family from becoming the next victim. Crime statistics are always a concern and being informed is important. The Windcrest Police Department continues to value our partnership with this wonderful community. We work hard daily to prevent crime and help to insure a safe, fear free community for everyone in the City of Windcrest. As your Chief, I am very proud of our proactive efforts and professional response. An informed community is a stronger community and in an effort to further strengthen our community partnership, I will begin publishing a monthly crime blotter.



The blotter will include all Part I crimes such as homicide, sexual assaults, aggravated assaults, robbery, burglary, theft, vehicle theft and arson, as well as, Part II crimes that involve arrests such as other assaults, criminal mischief, drug and weapon offenses, driving while intoxicated, curfew violations and recovered stolen vehicles. The Windcrest Police Department responds daily to other calls for service ranging from alarms to welfare checks. While it would be impractical to list every single call for service, other types of incidents will be listed such as vehicle accidents, disturbances and wanted persons. Currently, due to the amount of data included, the blotter will not be included in the monthly newsletter, but will be available soon on our website and also available in my monthly City Council report. The Windcrest Police Department recently acquired Spillman Crime Analytics which will soon enable the department to produce monthly crime maps. Analytics will allow the department to track crimes across the city on a daily, weekly, monthly and annual basis. This will assist the department in responding more effectively and efficiently when addressing areas that have been affected by crimes such as vehicle burglaries. As always, if you questions or concerns, please contact me, I am your Chief and my door is always open.

Windcrest Volunteer Fire Department

The personnel of the Windcrest Volunteer Fire Department trained on a new Smart Board that is located in the Golfcrest Dormitory. It is essentially a wall mounted computer with multiple functions that provides the capability for multimedia including Power Point Presentations, Video and access to the internet. This newly acquired technology allows personnel to video record training sessions and allows playback for review. This technology is to be utilized for fire and medical training for all of our personnel. In addition it can also be utilized for Fire, Medical and Emergency Management planning and operations during special events, severe weather and disasters. It is a valuable tool for all our members.

Lately people may have driven by the Fire Station at times during the day and seen different fire apparatus (fire engines and ladder trucks) sitting on the apron. The department has been looking at new apparatus to gain ideas pertaining to new technology and equipment for the organization. This is to replace old outdated apparatus and equipment as well as to expand capabilities for the future. If you see these new apparatus and equipment, please feel free to stop by and look and ask questions. In addition, there have been a lot of questions pertaining to the fire department in regards to personnel, dormitories, station, apparatus and equipment. If you have questions and want to see for yourself what is going on, don't hesitate to stop by for a tour and to ask questions. We are more than happy to show anyone around and answer questions.

We are still in the spring mode as far as weather but things are rapidly heating up and summer will be upon us quickly. As people are performing yard work, remember to stay hydrated and take breaks when necessary. Heat related injuries can sneak up on individuals very quickly and staying hydrated and cool is a way to possibly prevent a call to 911 or being transported to the hospital.

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Windcrest Animal Control Task Force



Flea preventative treatments are a year-round must-have for cats AND dogs! Not only are fleas a nuisance to you and your pets, they can carry diseases that can debilitate your furry friends (and in some cases even cause death). A simple way to test if your pet has fleas is to brush over your pet with a paper towel, or part the hair and look at their skin. If you don't find any adult fleas, you'll likely see their feces (also called "flea dirt") which look like small dark specks. Fleas ingested by your pet while grooming may result in tapeworms (You may notice what looks like a piece of white rice moving on their bottom or in their stool. This is a sign of tapeworms, which can be treated with oral medication). Adult fleas only represent 5% of the flea population, so it's important to have a routine that addresses all the life stages (eggs, larvae, pupae). Monthly topical combo products (like Revolution or AdvantageMulti) can kill up to 98% of fleas in various life stages and also protect pets from ticks, heartworms (carried by mosquitoes), and some intestinal parasites (roundworms, hookworms) too! Indoor pets are also at risk! Some studies have shown that 1/3 of heartworm infections were in indoor-only pets! Keep your pets healthy and happy - talk to your vet for more info, or you can join TxWeACT at our monthly meeting which is the fourth Tuesday of the month @ the Cross Road Church (at the corner of Midcrown and Walzem) @ 7pm.

Our Central Texas summers are filled with plenty of outdoor activities and fun in the sun. If you are planning on being outdoors on a hot summer day you can take simple precautions to keep you and your family members safe from the summer heat. Stay cool and make simple changes in your fluid intake, activities and clothing during hot weather to help reduce the risk of hyperthermia and heat stroke.



- Pack your cooler with water, ice and cool packs or cloths. Avoid caffeinated and alcoholic beverages which are diuretics and can dehydrate you.
- Dress for the heat in loose, light colored clothing, wear a hat and use sunscreen.
- Stay hydrated and drink more water than usual, 2 to 4 eight ounce cups of water every hour when outside for long periods of time, and when performing strenuous work or exercise.
- Don't over-exercise, take breaks and seek the shade or air conditioning to cool yourself down.
- Keep an eye on children, pets and the elderly for signs and symptoms of heat exhaustion and heat stroke.

WARNING SIGNS AND SYMPTOMS OF HEAT EMERGENCIES

Signs of Heat Exhaustion:

- Heavy sweating
- Weakness
- Cold, pale and clammy skin
- Fast, weak pulse
- Nausea or vomiting
- Urine dark in color or lack of need to urinate; you should urinate at least once every 3-4 hours

What To Do:

- Move to a cooler location
- Lie down and loosen your clothing
- Apply cool, wet cloths or compresses to as much of your body as possible
- Sip water
- If you have vomited and continues, seek medical attention immediately

Final Note:

Mild heat emergencies can quickly and continually progress to severe heat exhaustion and heat stroke if left untreated.
