The November elections are behind us and we welcomed three new Councilmembers during our November 19th meeting. 
32 years and have two adult children. They have lived in the greater San Antonio and Windcrest area for over thirteen years.

Don't be a Victim this Holiday Season!

The 2018 Holiday Season is upon us and as the City of Windcrest prepares for the Annual Season of Light-Up, be prepared for increased traffic, increased commerce and an increase in criminal activity! You must have a plan and we have tips on what you can do to prevent crime and reduce your chances of becoming a victim during this joyous holiday season.

It's easy to let your guard down and increase your risk while preparing for the holidays with shopping, decorating, and other festive events. These holiday crime prevention tips will insure that you are doing everything possible to prevent a holiday tragedy. We anticipate increased vehicular traffic in the City this season, exceeding previous years with our Light-Up Celebration, so please watch for vehicles while walking, running, or biking.

Around the House:

- Never leave garage doors open, or vehicles unlocked.
- Keep your curtains closed.
- Keep gifts hidden, never leaving them wrapped and under the tree until you're ready to celebrate with your family.
- Avoid strangers, post a "No Solicitation" sign on your front door.
- Be very cautious when allowing anyone into your home...especially any company you may hire for a job, such as carpet cleaning, chimney sweeping, or furnace repair.
- Use reputable firms that are bonded and complete background checks on their employees, and never leave workers unattended.
- Make sure you keep your mail and papers picked up, and if you're going out of town, have a friend or neighbor watch over your home. Please contact your Windcrest Police Department to complete a request for house checks!

While out Shopping:

- Dress comfortably and avoid wearing expensive or excessive iewelry
- Be patient and choose parking in well-lit areas with increased pedestrian traffic.

- Scan the parking lot before you exit your vehicle and when you return to your vehicle.
- Always check your vehicle interior when you return after shopping.
- Avoid carrying large amounts of cash; use your debit card instead!
- Shop in the daytime; avoid night shopping unless you are with a spouse or friend.
- Never leave any property in your vehicle.
- If you are at the mall, never go out to your vehicle, leave packages, and return to another store. Criminals love the holidays and they can't wait to take what you have.
- If you have a need to put something in the trunk after shopping, and you want to stay at the mall, do so, but move your vehicle to another area after items are placed in the trunk...remember, criminals are watching!
- Always stay alert and be very aware of strangers approaching you for anything. Ladies, try to avoid using purses...keep your identification, cash, debit card and/or credit cards in a small wallet that you can easily conceal.
- There are lots of inexpensive items that will allow you to conceal your items in a holder that hangs around your neck and inside your sweater, shirt or jacket. This keeps your hands free and will avoid providing a focused target for thieves who will not hesitate in assaulting you to take your purse, wallet, or other property from you.
- While out and about, keep your vehicle doors locked and your windows up. Never respond to pedestrians approaching your vehicle at intersections or stop signs.

Criminals are everywhere and will use any means necessary to take advantage of you. Drive defensively and avoid all confrontations with aggressive drivers. Code Compliance and Enforcement

May you and your family enjoy this wonderful Christmas spirit and holiday season. The City of Windcrest is known as the City of Lights and continues to attract hundreds of visitors into the City throughout the holiday season. Please keep as many vehicles off the street as possible during Christmas Light-Up viewing hours. Also, please keep your yards looking beautiful, cutting the grass prevents rodent infestation. Mend any fences that may entice intruders to enter or allow pets to roam. Lastly, when working on your yard please do not blow the dreaded leaves into the City streets. There is no ordinance requiring you to remove your leaves from your property, however, blowing leaves or grass trimmings onto other neighbors yards, or leaving them on the street, is littering.

Sec. 28-117. - Accumulating and disposing of garbage and brush prohibited in alleys and drains. No person may store any brush or garbage in an alley, or areas immediately adjacent to alleys, or drains. Any garbage and brush set out for removal must be containerized.

Positive Solutions for Barking Dogs!

Here are a few ideas to consider when dealing with a barking dog! Speaking with your neighbor first usually works much better than calling the police the first time. Try to block the dog's view, or try to make friends by talking to the dog.



Sometimes just hearing your friendly voice could make all the difference. Learn the dog's name and giving a "no" command using the dog's name just may work.

Attention-seeking barking is used to gain attention. The dog is trying to communicate, usually with their owners, so it's important to pay attention to context and tone when dogs bark continuously. Happy, sad, hungry, want to go for a walk, or just want a hug, barking dogs are trying to tell you something.


Alarm barking is not always limited to defending their territory. They could be unable to move freely because their leash is wrapped around a tree or snagged.

Greeting barking is a bark to say "hello!" Greeting barking is normally accompanied by relaxed body language and a wagging tail. They are glad to see you! Show them you are glad to see them too.

You can also use a dog whistle or sonic training device. Silent whistles make a sound that only dogs can hear. Whenever the dog barks, blow the whistle. It may take a number of attempts, but eventually the dog will associate barking with the unpleasant noise of the whistle, and stop barking. Remember...barking dogs are trying to communicate, so consistency is key!

WEDC Continues to Attract New Companies to Windcrest

Windcrest Economic Development Corporation (WEDC) continues to see significant activity from companies considering a site in our community. "The attraction of new jobs and payrolls remain the priority for WEDC," according to Colonel Sue Alexander, President of the Board of Directors. "By attracting more employment, we will see the sales of our local businesses increase, therefore, providing additional sales tax revenue for the City," added Col Sue. "This can also help hold down the local property taxes of our citizens and bring more resources for things like streets".

Most recently Ferguson, a national company in the plumbing products sector, opened a new operation in more than 40,000 sq. ft. of space in Windcrest and will employ 15 to 20 when at full operations. The company will carry a large inventory at its Windcrest site which will support two other Ferguson locations in the area as well as provide residential and commercial products regionally.

Another exciting new employer will be in operation in the first quarter of 2019. CED Greentech is a division of Consolidated Electrical Distributors and provides cutting edge Solar PV and Electrical products. Focusing on contractors needs statewide, Greentech also ships nationally. The company will occupy about 17,000 sq. ft. of space and initially hire 4 employees.

Mario Hernandez, Windcrest Economic Development Corporation's Executive Director, is in frequent if not daily contact with these new businesses to Windcrest and other businesses considering locating in Windcrest. Mr. Hernandez helps "grease the skids," so to speak, in assisting new businesses to quickly work through the red tape involved in setting up a business. He also helps get information and answers to questions for businesses considering moving their business to Windcrest.




