

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Mayor's Message

As I write this article, I am reminded of the Historical Plaque located at the corner of Golfcrest and Midcrown at the base a wonderful mature Oak tree. This historical marker was placed in 1974 and was recently renovated. It gives a brief history of Windcrest, including the first home built in 1955 and beginning of our "Light Up". The plaque says Windcrest was built in a "comprehensive development plan resulting in a community of beauty and charm."

A Mayor of a small city was quoted in a book I am reading that "The majority of issues that our community is facing would be eliminated or drastically reduced if we could just figure out a way to become a community of great neighbors". The book challenges the reader to make a chart with your home in the middle and the homes around. The challenge is to write the names of the people who live around you and note something about each family. What a great idea! The charm of Windcrest is wide streets, big homes and great services with a rich history. I would like to be a part of getting Windcrest back to our roots. I encourage all of you get to know your neighbors.

As of this writing, we have hired a new city secretary, and taken action to hire a new Fire Chief and Police Chief the week of March 11. I am excited about the leadership team and look forward to working with them as we transition to a new future.

As a reminder, the City Council voted to propose changes to our City Charter for consideration during the May Election. The changes that are to be considered will be in the form of fourteen Propositions. The Council discussed these Propositions during two City Council meetings and two Public Hearings. They received citizen inputs and adjusted the language based on the comments. The City is not allowed to take a position either for or against these Propositions, but will provide the citizens with information on what the Propositions will change. The following are key dates in this election cycle:

- **Thursday, April 4th** – last day to register to vote or change your address for the May Election
- **Monday, April 22nd** – Early Voting Starts (*no voting on Friday April 26th through Sunday April 28th*)
- **Tuesday, April 30th** – Last Day of Early Voting
- **Saturday, May 4th** – Election Day Voting
- **Wednesday, March 20th** – 1st Day that Mail Ballots will be sent out

We strongly encourage citizens to be informed and vote on these Propositions in May – this is your City Charter. The City Staff will be updating the website and we will ensure the information is on our Facebook page.

WCID #10 begins long-needed repairs


Engineer Leonard Young's assessment of the Water District's infrastructure found only 11 miles of our 32.5 miles of water system pipes had ever been replaced. 65% of the system is over its life expectancy of 40 years old. Our sewer system has 27 miles of pipe, and 75% of the system is beyond its life expectancy of 40 years. The electrical system components at the 4 producing well sites were more than 20 years old and had reached the recommended service life. The total bill for all needed repairs was \$12,977,260. Our engineer assured the Water Board that we could do these repairs/replacements in phases over 5-10 years and still ensure that our customers have dependable service and safe drinking water. We created a Citizens Rate Committee to study our residential and commercial rates, which have not been raised since the 1990s. The District also obtained AA-bond rating from an independent rating agency. At the WCID #10 Board meeting February 27, 2019, the Water Board approved the sale of a revenue note for \$5,000,000 to finance the first portion of Phase I of the District's CIP. The Board will borrow the remaining \$2,000,000 in November 2019.

Phase I improvements include:

- Replace water piping on Zephyr to Cloudmont and on Windrock Drive from Eaglecrest to Windrock Circle
- Replace water mains crossing at all intersection on Midcrown from Crestway to Golfcrest
- Make needed repairs and replacements on well #3
- Needed repair/replace of electrical equipment on wells 4 and 2
- Purchase a portable generator to run water wells in case of emergency power loss
- Add water crossing at Eaglecrest and Crestway
- Replace short water line in Sunhaven alley
- Replace water lines in alley between Fawndale and Moorside
- Shadow Oaks sewer

The construction will occur in phases. If you want to know about repairs or planned water outages, check out the District's website (bexarcountrywcid#10.com) and look under Special Announcements) beginning in late May or early June. Phase I of the CIP will be complete in about 2 years. When complete, the City will have sewer and water lines that will last about 40 years in area from Crestway on the North to Walzem on the south and west of Midcrown.

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

Living with urban wildlife

Wild animals explore, sniff, and climb about in a variety of places, from remote forest and desert habitat to the noisy, flashing, and hard-edged confines of bustling cities.



They are clever beings who may dine on such natural fare as frogs, crayfish, rats, mice, roaches, birds' eggs, wild fruit, and even human food and housing that is unintentionally provided.

Injured wildlife


If you find an injured wild animal, first call Animal Control at 210-655-2666. Try to contain the animal and keep him in a stress-free environment until you can contact with a wildlife rehabilitator or veterinarian. Do not give the animal food or water unless instructed to do so by a rehabilitator.

Wild animals may not understand that you are trying to help them, and may attempt to bite you in self-defense. Place an appropriately sized box on its side and gently usher the animal in with a broom, window screen, trowel, or similar implement. Return the box to the upright position, place a lid or cover on top (with air holes) and keep the box in a quiet, dark location while making transport arrangements with the Animal Control or rehabilitator.

Happy Spring to all our Windcrest residents! It's that wonderful time of year to start some spring cleaning! It's also that time of year when the green grass, weeds, and vegetation start to grow rapidly. Please keep in mind not to wait until your grass is overgrown, the first violation notice delivered to your door is to advise you of what the violation is and how long you have to correct the violation. Any future violations for the same issue within the same calendar year can have you receiving a summons to appear in court. Schedule your property maintenance accordingly and help us ensure that our city stays looking wonderful.

Remember to prepare items you may want to dispose of and take advantage of the spring curbside brush pick up. Please, do not put items out too early. Please read the mail notification carefully in order to determine your pick-up times. Don't forget to clean the backyard, trim your branches and cut the vegetation, grass and weeds in the alley area behind your property. Swimming pools must remain clean and clear to prevent unsafe conditions. Plan a pool maintenance schedule to prevent mosquito breeding.

Trap-Neuter-Return approach

- **TRAP:** Humane traps
- **NEUTER:** Take the cats in their traps to a veterinarian or clinic to be spayed or neutered, vaccinated, and ear-tipped.
- **RETURN:** After the cats have recovered from surgery, return them to their outdoor homes where they were trapped.

Trap-Neuter-Return is the humane and effective approach for stray and feral cats. Now in practice for decades in the US, after being proven in Europe, scientific studies show that Trap-Neuter-Return improves the lives of feral/community cats, improves their relationships with the people who live near them, and decreases the size of colonies over time. That's why the number of municipalities that officially endorse this approach increased tenfold between 2003 and 2013. Grounded in science, TNR stops the breeding cycle of cats and therefore

improves their lives. It is a fact that the removal and killing of outdoor cats is not effective. Since feral cats are not adoptable, they are killed in pounds and shelters. Windcrest adopted the TNR program in 2009. Since then more and more people have stepped up to be a part of the solution by offering to be cat caregivers. This means monitoring the group of cats by making sure they have food, water, and proper care. It takes spending time and resources to trap, transport the cat to a clinic for the sterilization & rabies shot, and then providing the care necessary while the cat recovers. After recovery, the cat is returned to its area where trapped.

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GRASP Serves Windcrest Seniors

Greater Randolph Area Services Program has been serving seniors residing in small cities in northeast Bexar County since 1983 by providing transportation, meals, and other human services including rent, utility and food assistance.

GRASP Transit serves Windcrest seniors by providing transportation to medical appointments and shopping with curb to curb service in wheelchair accessible buses.

Services must be scheduled in advance for service are based on distance to the destination and wait time (if needed) starting at \$5.00. Caregivers or a family member may accompany the client at no charge. The service operates 8:00 AM to 4:00 PM Monday to Friday.

The agency also operates the GRASP Community Center located in Converse which provides daily activities, hot noon meals, day trips, games, seminars, and more for seniors over age 60. The program is supported with funding from Bexar Agency on Aging, United Way, Bexar County CDBG grants and local support. GRASP transports seniors from their home to the center daily.

Other GRASP services include financial assistance and referrals to help avoid disconnection of CPS services, and rental assistance. GRASP also operates the largest food pantry in northeast Bexar County as a member of the San Antonio Food Bank. 
Spring Brush Pick-Up 2019

On Monday, May 20th the Spring Brush Pick up service will begin. The service will be available according to which section of the city your home is located in. 


