

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Mayor's Message

As most of you are aware, we re-established our time honored relationship with the Windcrest Volunteer Fire Association (WVFA). The WVFA hit the ground running the "Fill the Boot" campaign during Light Up. They experienced record setting contributions during Light Up and then immediately set their sights on the 7th Annual Firefighter "Gala of Lights", in honor of Barbee Winn. The Gala will take place on Saturday, March 2 at the Granberry Hills Event Center, just outside of Windcrest.

On Friday, May 17, the firefighters will challenge our Police Department in a softball game at Takas Park. The next day, Saturday, May 18, the WVFS will hold their annual Firefighter's Picnic, which is also at Takas Park.

Quick Trip, a new business located at the intersection of I-35 and Eisenhower, is set to begin construction at the beginning of April. They have proven to be excellent Corporate partners and will bring added sales tax to our City.

The City Council voted to include changes to our City Charter for consideration during the May Election. The changes that are to be considered will be in the form of fourteen Propositions. The Council discussed these Propositions during two City Council meetings and two Public Hearings. They received citizen input and adjusted the language based on the comments. The City is not allowed to take a position either for or against these Propositions, but we will provide the citizens with information on what the Propositions will change. The following are key dates in this election cycle.

- **Thursday, April 4th** – last day to register to vote or change your address for the May Election
- **Monday, April 22nd** – Early Voting Starts (*No Voting on Friday, April 26th through Sunday, April 28th*)
- **Tuesday, April 30th** – Last Day of Early Voting
- **Saturday, May 4th** – Election Day Voting
- **Wednesday, March 20th-April 1st** – Day that Mail Ballots will be sent out

We strongly encourage citizens to be informed and vote on these Propositions in May – this is YOUR City Charter.

We are working hard to update the City website, our Facebook page, as well as, this Newsletter. We welcome your input as we progress.

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

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

Happy Spring to all our Windcrest residents! It's that wonderful time of year to start some spring cleaning! It's also that time of year when the green grass, weeds, and vegetation start to grow rapidly. To avoid a code violation, please not wait until your grass is overgrown. If you have a code violation, the first notice delivered to your door will advise you of the violation and the time allowed to correct it. Any future violations for the same issue within the same calendar year can generate a summons to appear in court. Schedule your property maintenance accordingly and help us ensure that our city stays looking wonderful.

Remember to prepare any items you may want to dispose of and take advantage of our spring curbside brush pickup. Please read the postcard notification regarding the brush pickup carefully in order to determine your pick-up times. Please do not bring brush out to the curb any earlier than the date for your address. Don't forget to clean the backyard, trim your branches, and cut the vegetation, grass, and weeds in alley area behind your property fence. Swimming pools must remain clean and clear to prevent unsafe conditions; plan a pool maintenance schedule to prevent mosquito breeding.

Animal Care & Control

Can I keep a lost pet?

Once you have a stray dog in your possession, your first obligation is to the health and safety of the dog. Additionally, you are required by law to take steps to find the dog's owner.

Although it may be tempting to keep a lost pet and try to find the owner yourself, it is absolutely essential that the animal be scanned for a microchip. Take pets with no ID to an Animal Control Agency. They are the one obvious place where owners are likely to look for lost pets.

Some people won't call Animal Control because they believe it will result in the dog being euthanized. In fact, in most cases, animal control can improve a dog's chances of getting back home, and/or adopted.

You can't keep every stray dog in your house. If you can't provide a safe place for a dog, then a shelter may be a better option. It may also work out that you can turn a dog over to Animal Control, and then if the dog isn't claimed in 7 business days, you can adopt the dog.

What to do if you lose your pet?

Contact your local Animal Control agencies. File a lost pet report with every shelter within a 20-mile radius of your home and visit the nearest shelters daily, if possible. To find your local shelter, search online or check your phone book. Notify the police if you believe your pet was stolen.

We can then trap them all, spay mom and try to socialize the kittens for adoption. If you find puppies, call animal control (210-655-2666) and they will make every effort to trap the whole family and take them into their care.

We are still looking for Trap, Neuter, Return (TNR) caregivers for our feral and community cats. This solution is definitely helping with the reduction of unwanted cats in our community. We meet on the 4th Tuesday of each month at 7 PM at Cross Roads Church at the corner of Midcrown and Walzem.

We have a number of events that we participate in during each year. The next one coming up is the Fiesta Especial Parade right here in Windcrest on April 20th. If you have a heart for furry critters, come join us!



Spring Brush Pick-Up 2019

On Monday, May 20th the Spring Brush Pick up service will begin. The service will be available according to which section of the city your home is located in. A map of the sections will be available at City Hall, on the City website and a postcard will be mailed out to make sure you understand which section your house is in.



SECTION 1: Curb service will begin **Monday, May 20th** and run through **Friday, May 24th**. Everyone in Section 1 must have their collectables out on the curb by Sunday, May 19th and no earlier than Friday, May 17th. Our recycle company is Republic Services, they will go through each section once. If you are late putting your collection items out, they will not return for additional service.

SECTION 2: Curb service will begin **Monday, May 27th** and run through **Friday, May 31st**. Everyone in Section 2 must have their collectables out on the curb by Sunday, May 26th and no earlier than Friday, May 24th. Republic Services will go through each section once. If you are late putting your collection items out, they will not return for additional service.

SECTION 3: Curb service will begin **Monday, June 3rd** and run through **Friday, June 7th**. Everyone in Section 3 must have their collectables out on the curb by Sunday, June 2nd and no earlier than Friday, May 31st. Republic Services will go through each section once. If you are late putting your collection items out, they will not return for additional service.
